


The Mood Enlightenment of Twitter

As we bid 2018 adieu and ring in the New Year, many may be tempted to write off the year's events as another in a series of 'dumpster fires,' as 2016 and 2017 have been called. Between human cognitive bias and the marketing strategy of some news outlets, our culture tends to overfocus on the negative news. Therefore, we at The Torch would like to recap the most uplifting news stories of 2018.

Many will recall back in July when the 13 junior members of the "Wild Boars" soccer team were trapped in a flooded cave network in northern Thailand. Rescuers and engineers from eight countries-including Thailand, the United States, England, China, Japan, Sweden, Myanmar, and Laos- worked tirelessly to rescue all thirteen members of the "Wild Boars" Soccer team. After a seventeen-day effort, during which valiant diver Saman Kunan perished when attempting to save the boys, all thirteen young men were rescued unharmed.

Among the various breakthroughs in the scientific community, what has been called the largest land animal to ever exist on Earth, a 26,000-pound dinosaur known as Ledumahadi mafube, was discovered in South Africa last September. This relative of the brontosaurus was more than twice the size of a modern African Elephant. In the field of medicine, two patients with severe age-related macular degeneration, the most prevalent cause of blindness, were recently restored to sight through means of a revolutionary new stem cell treatment, courtesy of the London Project to Cure Blindness. Finally, NASA recently revealed a slew of 21 newly discovered constellations using Fermi's Large Area Telescope (LAT). Scientists at LAT have chosen to name the constellations

after national monuments (such as the Washington Monument and the Eiffel Tower), influential figures (such as Albert Einstein), and even cultural icons, including the USS Enterprise, Godzilla, and the Incredible Hulk.

US Homicide rates have decreased by 7.6% since just last year, contributing to an overall decrease in the crime rate over the past few decades. Child Mortality has plummeted by more than half over the past few decades (and continues to do so) dropping from 12.5 million deaths of children under 5 in 1990 to 5.5 million last year. Those numbers may seem staggering, (which they are) and reveal just as many problems as they do progress. Die Hard? A Christmas Movie?

Abolishing the Franchise Tag Ralph DeSevo '20

Pittsburgh Steelers star running back, Le'Veon Bell has recently just decided to sit out the entirety of the 2018 NFL season. His reason for missing this season was because the Steelers did not offer him a lengthy contract extension but instead a one year franchise tag. Bell reluctantly signed the franchise tag this past year with the Steelers, and this time he refused to sign it. If he signed the deal and played this year, he was due to make \$14.5 million. Many people are puzzled as to why Bell would leave so much money on the table. The reason is because when a player is franchise tagged, said player has almost no power over their future and gives all the power to the owners of the team. Because of the corruptness of this practice, the franchise tag should be abolished.

You may be wondering what the franchise tag is, and why do players not want to sign this deal. It is a one year deal worth no less than the average of the top five salaries at that player's position. While this is a large sum of money, it would only be for a year, which leaves the player with no security. If a player were to suffer a season-ending injury that year, it would be unlikely that he would be able to get a big contract. Teams would offer him shorter contracts with less money since they are unsure if he will be able to play like his old self. In fact, this happened to Seattle Seahawks safety, Earl Thomas. After

being franchise tagged by Seattle, Earl reluctantly decided to play in the regular season after sitting out all of the preseason. Earl was seeking a long term deal with Seattle, but they refused to offer him a contract. In a Week 4 game against the Arizona Cardinals, Earl Thomas broke his leg late in the 4th quarter. He was out for the remainder of the year. Now with his NFL future in jeopardy, it is unlikely that a team will offer Thomas a long term deal. That is why players like Le'Veon Bell are deciding to sit out. They do not want to seriously hurt themselves and possibly put their careers in trouble without long term security.

Multiple superstars in the NFL are finding ways to gain leverage to fight against the restrictions of franchise tagging. In most cases, when a player is franchise tagged, they decide to sit out all of the preseason and training camp in order to avoid injury. This year, the two best defensive players in the NFL decided to not play until their team offered them a long term contract. Khalil Mack, former defensive player of the year for the Oakland Raiders, refused to play in the preseason and said he would not play in the regular season either. This did not make head coach, Jon Gruden, too happy. Jon Gruden decided to trade Mack to the Chicago Bears in exchange for two first round picks. After being traded to Chicago, Mack signed a six-year deal

worth \$141 million. This trade was a direct result of the franchise tag being placed on Khalil Mack. Now the Chicago Bears are playoff bound after the addition of Mack, and the Oakland Raiders are likely to have the first pick in the next NFL Draft.

Another player who threatened to sit out all of the regular season after being franchise tagged was Aaron Donald of the Los Angeles Rams. This was the second time that Donald has been franchise tagged. The 2017 defensive player of the year refused to play another game for the Rams unless he was offered a long term deal. He got exactly what he wanted. He signed a six-year \$135 million deal. This was another example of a player advocating against the team that franchise tagged him.

The franchise tag needs to be addressed by NFL commissioner, Roger Goodell. It has started to create rifts between players and their organizations. The franchise tag is also very unfair to the players. They are forced to play under a one-year deal where they have no control over their future. Now, there is superstars like Le'Veon Bell sitting out regular season games, and everyone wants to see the best players actually playing, not sitting on the sidelines. This needs to be changed before the NFLPA starts to protest, and before there is another player lockout.



The Armistice: 100 Years Later Conor Morris '21



One hundred years ago on November 11th in 2018, the world's first war came to an end with the signing of the armistice in France. So long after the signing, that day has not been forgotten as countries all over the world honor those who fought and sacrificed their lives in the war. Many remember the day in somber while others choose to rejoice in the conclusion of the civil unrest. Throughout the world, red poppies were displayed to commemorate those who lost their lives in battle. The red poppies were the first flowers to spring up from the grounds of the battlefields in Belgium, and it is rumored that the reason the flowers were red was due to the blood of the soldiers that seeped into the soil.

In addition to the red poppies, countries around the world held events in commemoration to the end of the first world war. In England, the Prime Minister, Theresa May, laid a wreath on the first and last soldiers' graves that were killed in the fighting. France, where the armistice was signed, held numerous ceremonies including a symbolic meeting at the train carriage where the armistice was signed 100 years prior. President Trump and First Lady Melania Trump attended the Arc de Triomphe ceremony held in France. During this ceremony, thousands of flowers were displayed outside of the Paris City Hall, and the 9.7 million people who died fighting were remembered for their brave service. Prince Harry attended a service at the National Memorial Arboretum, a year-round site of remembrance for the war, in the United Kingdom where he read the poem, "The Soldier," written by Rupert Brooke at the beginning of the first world war. Additionally, in California, the California Military constructed an exhibit for the 100th anniversary in order to commemorate the armistice at the state library in Sacramento. The city of San Diego, California, held a WWI Armistice Centennial Concert and Ball where all attendees dressed in formal wear suitable for the 1900-1920 time period.
