

Dear Class of 2025 Family,

It is my pleasure to welcome you to our CBA community and to what I know will be an amazing school year! I hope that each of you has had a great summer filled with fun and relaxation. As the school year begins there are many activities to introduce your son to the traditions of CBA, as well as help him prepare for the start of his important journey.

The first of these events are the **Tips for Success Days** 8/26, 8/27, 8/30, 8/31. As mentioned in my June letter students have been assigned to a day based on last name.

Tips for Success will run from 9am to 12:00pm and start in the library. The day will include time for outdoor games so students may wear comfortable clothes (shorts, sneakers etc.) Students are not required to bring anything as everything will be provided.

The **Freshmen Welcome Day/Heath Run** will be on **Friday, September 17, 2021**. The Freshmen Run has been a tradition at Christian Brothers Academy for more than fifty years. In addition to the run there will be some friendly class competition among the freshmen homerooms and lunch. Freshmen should wear their gym clothes and sneakers to school that day. Lunch will be provided for all freshmen on that day. Dismissal will be at the regular time.

Another important event is **Freshmen Oath Day** which will take place on **Wednesday**, **October 13**, **2021**. Oath Day is an opportunity for our freshmen to learn more about the Academy Oath. The day includes a keynote speaker, discussions and an assembly at which the freshmen recite and sign their class copy of the oath. Students should wear the normal school dress code with a blazer.

The following are events for parents:

- Freshman Parent Night/Back to School Night is Wednesday, September 22, 2021. The evening will begin with a brief meeting at 6:30pm in the Varsity Gym.
- Freshmen Parent Guidance Night which will be on Wednesday, October 6, at 6:30pm in Henderson Theater.

The Guidance Counselor for the Class of 2025 is Ms. Nicole Johnson. She will schedule meetings with each freshman early in the school year. Freshmen students and parents who have concerns about academics or the transition to high school can email her at njohnson@cbalincroftnj.org

The *Big Brother* program will continue this year to assist our freshmen as they navigate the transition to high school. Each freshman will be paired with a junior big brother who we hope will provide invaluable mentoring throughout the year and beyond. The first *Big Brother* social will be on October 8, 2021.

Other things to note as we return to school:

- Students are expected to follow Covid-19 protocols including not attending school if ill. Parents of students who have been exposed to covid-19 or who are exhibiting symptoms should contact me as soon as possible as I will be handling any necessary contact tracing.
- Freshmen should arrive at school no later than 8:20am (but we prefer 8:15am to give time to find their way) on Tuesday September 7, 2021 and report directly to Henderson Theater. Dismissal will be at 12:30pm. Parents are asked to pick up at 12:45pm to ease congestion on those first days. Freshmen will not attend school on September 8, 2021.



- It is suggested that students bring an empty backpack as state loaned textbooks will be distributed.
- The school building will be open daily at 7:15am. Students arriving early should report to the library, cafeteria or if necessary the designated overflow areas. The library and if necessary designated overflow areas will be open until 5pm each day.
- The Pegasus Yearbook is an award winning student publication that chronicles the many events of the school year. Yearbooks can be ordered online at https://www.cbalincroftnj.org/website-forms/yearbook-order/ or by bringing cash or check (in an envelope with student's name) to the main office. Yearbook orders are due by November 5, 2021. The cost is \$35 if purchased by November 5, 2021. Yearbooks ordered after that will be \$45. No orders will be accepted after January 28, 2022. To avoid waste we will order only enough yearbooks to cover the orders so if you would like a yearbook please be sure to order one.

Finally, I would like to take the opportunity to encourage you to urge your son to get involved in the many extracurricular and co-curricular activities offered at CBA. Clubs meet both before and after school and during the enrichment period to ensure that students have as many opportunities to participate as possible. On September 15, 2021 students will have the opportunity to explore clubs during the **Enrichment Club Fair**.

In keeping with our mission, CBA's extracurricular activities provide a unique opportunity to nourish the whole personmind, body and spirit. Our many clubs and activities allow students to take their learning beyond the classroom and to nurture passions outside of the realm of the academic curriculum. From competitive activities such as our science, math and academic teams, to spiritual activities such as our worship ministries, to cultural activities such as our world language and culture clubs, CBA currently offers a myriad of unique clubs and activities that encompasses a wide range of academic fields and interest areas. Students will be able to provide service to CBA and the wider community through organizations such as SADD and LaSallian Youth. It is our hope that students will be inspired to participate in the range of opportunities being offered to serve including several overnight service immersion trips.

In addition to service organizations, competitive clubs and cultural activities, CBA also offers a full range of performing arts activities including theater, the pipes and drums, jazz band and men's choir. All in all, I encourage each and every member of the Class of 2025 to be adventurous and to take a step outside of his comfort zone.
