Dear Member of Class of 2024 and Family,

- Students are expected to follow Covid-19 protocols including not attending school if ill. Parents of students who have been exposed to covid-19 or who are exhibiting symptoms should contact me as soon as possible.
- Sophomores should arrive at school no later than 8:20am on Tuesday September 7, 2021 and report directly to Homeroom. Dismissal will be at 12:30pm. Parents are asked to wait to pick up students until 12:45pm to ease congestion on those first days of school. Sophomores will not attend school on September 8, 2021.
- The school building will be open daily at 7:15 am. Students arriving early should report to the library, cafeteria or if necessary the designated overflow areas. The library and if necessary designated overflow areas will be open until 5pm each day.
- The Pegasus Yearbook is an award winning student publication that chronicles the many events of the school year.
