Junior College Planning Calendar

September

- Do your best work.
- Involve yourself deeply in activities.
- Enthusiastically participate in your College and Career Planning class. This class will provide you with important information relative to the college process.
- Begin to familiarize yourself with the many tools available in Maia including College Search Engines,
 Scholarship Search Engines, Career Information, Pre-College Summer Programs, numerous links to many helpful webpages and much more.
- Parents, please plan to attend the Junior Parent Night on Thursday, September 28 at 6:30 PM.

October

- Utilize one of the college search engines in Maia Learning to run a preliminary list of colleges for which you have some interest. Think about your desire to attend specific colleges with an emphasis on your goals, values, interests and abilities.
- Discuss a standardized testing plan with your counselor. Check out the test dates for the SAT, ACT or both. Register early. Utilize the test prep that works best for you.

November

- Juniors will begin to take career assessment tests in their College and Career Planning class, review the results and then take advantage of the huge amounts of career information available in Maia Learning.
- Beginning in the fall, juniors will formally meet with their counselor to discuss the college admissions process and develop a potential list of appropriate schools to consider.

December

Beginning in December after Junior PSAT scores are reported, parents, along with their sons, will be notified
of when their parent meeting has been scheduled. These meetings will take place during the day between the
months of January and March. During these meetings, questions related to the college admissions process
including the development of appropriate college lists which includes likely, target and reach schools will be
discussed.

January

- Register for one or more Spring SAT/ACT exams.
- Continue to do your best work. Your grades are an important factor in the college application review.

February

- Review your tentative college list with your parents. Share with them the reasons you have for including these schools on your list. Be Honest!!! Be Open!!! Listen to the remarks presented by both parents and counselor.
- This is a good time to plan college visits over your Easter break.
- Juniors should see their counselor to discuss the selection of senior courses.

March/April/May

- Take the SAT, ACT or both and register for additional tests as necessary.
- Upon receipt of your spring test scores, initiate a work schedule in the areas that you believe you may have a weakness. This will assist you in the summer or fall when you retake the tests.
- In College and Career Planning Class, create a Common Application account and begin to work on the sections that will rollover to the new version that comes out around August 1.
- Discuss teacher recommendation requests with your Guidance Counselor. Once finalized, ask two teachers (formally in person) if they will write you a letter of recommendation.

June

• Register for the August SAT or September ACT if appropriate.

July/August

- Visit colleges, refine your list, take tours and be interviewed. Talk to friends who graduated a year or two
 ago who currently attend a school on your list. Find out what their experience has been, or use our CBA
 Alumni database of graduates who would be happy to discuss their college experiences.
- Write a rough draft of your main college essay.
- Work on your college applications. Note for the Common Application, you must rollover the common portion of the Common Application, Do the FERPA release statement and formally invite teachers to send recommendations through Maia Learning AFTER AUGUST 1 when the new version arrives.
