The photo form has a QR code which allows you to place your order online using a credit card. If you'd rather pay by check, please bring the completed form and check to school on the 5th. If you pay online, you do not need to bring the photo form to school on picture day. Any student in violation of the Dress Code & Grooming requirements as stated in the handbook will not have his picture taken. - The school building will be open daily at 7:30AM. Students arriving early should report to the Library or the Dining Hall. The Library will be open until 5PM each day.
- The Pegasus Yearbook is an award winning student publication that chronicles the many events of the school year. Yearbooks can be ordered on the 2026 Class Page or by bringing cash or check (in an envelope with student's name) to the main office. Yearbook orders are due by November 10, 2023. The cost is \$50 if purchased by November 10, 2023. Yearbooks ordered after that will be \$60. No orders will be accepted after February 2, 2024. To avoid waste we will order only enough yearbooks to cover the orders so if you would like a yearbook please be sure to order one.



• 2022-2023 Yearbooks will be distributed in homeroom in September to those who ordered them.
